The **Hoh Rain Forest** is gorgeous.

Twilighters with plenty of time should schedule 3 to 4 (or more) hours to fully enjoy

- The Peak 6 Outdoor Store
- The Hard Rain Café and Mini-Mart
- The Hoh Ranger Station and Visitor Center
- A variety of short or long Hoh Rain Forest walking trails that begin at the Visitor Center

The Hoh Rain Forest *entrance* is only 13 miles south of Forks on Highway 101—about a 15 minute drive. From there, however, it's another 18 miles of very slow driving along the windy Upper Hoh Road to reach the Ranger Station and Visitor Center—at least a 45 minute drive.

- Head south on Highway 101 from the Forks Chamber of Commerce to the Hoh Rain Forest entrance.

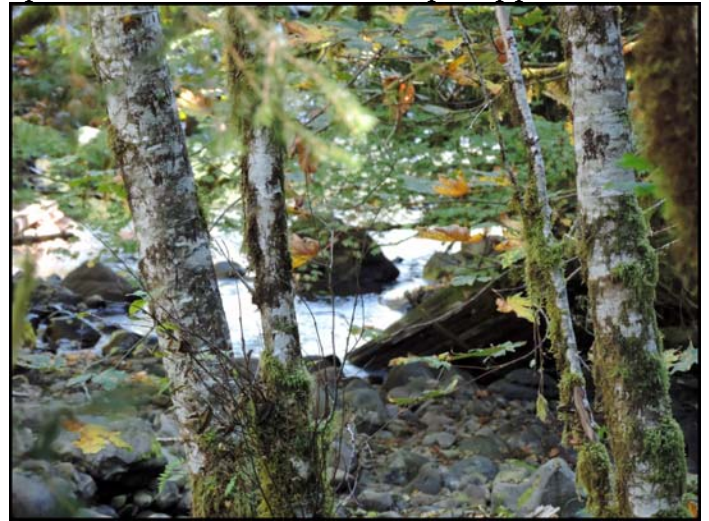
- Turn left and drive east along the Upper Hoh Road until you see the **3 Mile** sign. After that, continue down a short and steep switch-back until you see a bridge crossing a creek.

- Just before the bridge, you'll see what looks like a lay-by on the right. It's actually the mouth of a gated driveway that once led to an old homestead house. (The river changed course many years ago, undercut the house, and swept it away!)
- Park in that driveway, get out and wander around for 15 to 20 minutes.

The surrounding forest and nearby riverside offer a plethora of Hoh Rain Forest pic opportunities.



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- When you're done, head back to Forks.
The old homestead driveway allows room for you to turn around, and its mouth offers good visibility of oncoming traffic from both directions, so that you can safely pull back onto the road.
